In Uzbekistan, significant progress has been made. Presidential Decree No. PF-87 (March 7, 2022) introduced the "National Program for Enhancing Women's Participation in All Spheres of Economic, Political, and Social Life (2022–2026)." Key priorities of the program include:

- > Enhancing legal frameworks for protecting women's interests;
- Ensuring equal rights and opportunities for women and men;
- Strengthening labor rights for women;
- Protecting women from violence and harassment;
- Supporting women in correctional facilities and specialized education institutions;
- Combating human trafficking and supporting women working abroad;
- Promoting women's employment and entrepreneurship;
- ➤ Increasing women's involvement in decision-making processes;
- Expanding access to education and science for women;
- Encouraging sports participation and cultural engagement among women;
- Supporting elderly women socially and economically.

Challenges and Opportunities. Despite progress, challenges such as domestic violence, economic hardships, and family disputes persist. In some cases, cultural norms hinder women's social integration and limit their opportunities for self-expression. Addressing these barriers requires targeted efforts from both society and government.

Parental attitudes play a critical role in shaping girls' futures, alongside providing equal access to higher education. Educated women are more likely to contribute to raising a responsible, well-rounded generation. Uzbekistan has taken steps to support women through initiatives such as "Women's Entrepreneurship Centers" and preferential credit programs for female entrepreneurs.

Recognizing the societal importance of women, awards such as the "Zulfiya State Prize" have been established to honor outstanding young women excelling in education, science, arts, and public service.

The growing inclusion of women in socio-economic and cultural reforms demonstrates their increasing empowerment and transformation within society. Their contributions to these processes highlight the broader evolution of societal values in Uzbekistan.
