For example, "рука" (hand) can metaphorically mean "influence" or "help," producing expressions like "рука помощи" (helping hand). Similarly, metaphorical use of "пламя" (flame) to signify "passion" or "intense desire" leads to synonymy with other words representing similar emotions.

## **Style and Social Influence on Synonymy.**

Stylistic variation also gives rise to synonyms. Words with the same meaning may differ in tone or context. For instance, "старый" (old) and "пожилой" (elderly) convey similar ideas, but "пожилой" has a more neutral or respectful tone. Social changes influence synonymy, as political and religious terms shift meanings or gain new equivalents. The fall of the Soviet Union, for example, led to synonyms like "российский" (Russian) and "постсоветский" (post-Soviet).

## **Synonym Classification**

Synonyms in Russian are classified by:

### **1. Degree of Similarity**

- a) Absolute synonyms: words with identical meanings usable interchangeably (e.g., "огонь" and "пламя" for "fire").
- b) Relative synonyms: words replaceable in specific contexts with subtle meaning differences (e.g., "большой" (big) and "огромный" (huge)).

### **2. Usage Domain**

- a) Terminological synonyms: used in specialized fields (e.g., "пациент" (patient) and "больной" (sick person)).
- b) General synonyms: common in daily speech (e.g., "быстро" (fast) and "поспешно" (hastily)).

### **3. Stylistic Nuance**

- a) Neutral synonyms: devoid of stylistic coloring (e.g., "книга" (book) and "том" (volume)).
- b) Emotionally colored synonyms: with distinct emotional tones (e.g., "грустный" (sad) and "печальный" (melancholy)).
