The genius of Navoi and his image cannot be measured by any criterion or standard. Along with creating unique works, Navoi laid the foundation for a great literary language. He made significant contributions to the development of various fields not only as a great writer but also as a linguist, literary critic, and historian. No one doubts his multifaceted talent. I compare Navoi to a mighty river. Some of our scholars attempt to navigate this river in wooden boats. In my opinion, it is only possible to sail on this river in a sturdy ship built using modern scientific achievements. Navoi is truly a thinker who developed Nizami's creative traditions and matched his prowess" [3,360].

The field of Navoi studies has primarily developed in three main directions:

- 1. Philological analysis studying the linguistic and stylistic features of Navoi's works.
- 2. Historical and literary research investigations related to Navoi's life, his era, and contemporaries.
- 3. Artistic interpretation examining the characters, symbols, poetic devices, and their reflection in various works of Navoi.

Result
