- > creates an innovative strategy to achieve it;
- > seeks and acquires innovation (mainly through the market, or through another distribution mechanism, for example, companies);
- ➤ adapted to it rebuilding itself and the organization (the whole system) under innovations such as under a new strategy;
- ➤ adapts to innovation, that is, it adopts innovation, introduces innovation into its technology and updates it, transforms it into corporate culture, begins to implement its business operations in a new way with the help of innovation;
- > uses innovation and improves his qualifications (acquires new knowledge, skills), brings his activity to a new level of quality, benefits from new types of products and services created as a result of his activity. In a broad sense, the word "novatorl" includes the concept of "innovator".
